1250 Modes of Drama: Tragedy and Comedy next chapter But for now, to understand something of the nature of tragedy, let us take a brief overview of the subject One of the oldest and most durable of literary genres, tragedy is also one of the simplest—the protagonist undergoes a reversal of fortune, from good to bad, ending in catastrophe

Tragedy: downfall of a hero/heroine by fate and the will of the gods Typically they are trying to obtain some goal and in the process find a flaw within themselves, which leads to their ultimate downfall Satyr: short spoof of a myth (like a parody) Comedy: satire of public affairs and people (pokes fun

at real life)

Tragedy and ComedyThe Greeks wrote two kinds of drama—tragedy and comedy A tragedy was a serious drama about common themes such as love, hate, war, or betrayal These dramas featured a main character, or tragic hero The hero usually was an important person and often gifted with extraordinary abilities A tragic flaw usually caused the hero
