Anselm formulated a different form of the argument using the idea of God as a necessary being: 1, God is by definition, a necessary being 2, Existence is logically necessary to the concept of a necessary being 3, Therefore since God is a necessary being, he must exist One major objection to this argument was voiced by Immanuel Kant, amongst others

### **Moore's proof of an external world**

Consider, for example, the following proof of God's existence: 1 If what theists believe is true, God exists 2 What theists believe is true C God exists This argument meets Moore's first condition, since neither of the premises is identical to the conclusion; but it still seems to be circular in some sense

### **The design argument**

This argument for God's existence, however, faces an important challenge of which Paley could not have been aware This challenge came not from a philosopher finding a flaw in Paley's argument, but rather from Darwin's development of the theory of evolution This theory provides very strong reason to doubt premise 3 of Paley's

### **The Kalam Cosmological Argument**

The Kalam Cosmological Argument: 1Everything that begins to exist has a cause 2The universe began to exist 3Therefore, the universe has a cause I Many people are willing to sign on to the premises and the validity of the argument (so the conclusion), but don't think that this conclusion implies the existence of God (as philosophers do

God's existence is that without Him we couldn't prove any-thing at all! The existence of the biblical God is the prerequisite for knowledge and rationality This is called the "transcendental argument for God" or TAG for short It is a devastating and conclusive argument, one that only a few

THE MORAL ARGUMENT RUSSELL: But aren't you now saying in effect, I mean by God whatever is good or the sum total of what is good -- the system of what is good, and, therefore, when a young man loves anything that is good he is loving God Is that what ...

taken for granted "A GOD capable of proof would be no GOD at all" (Jacobi) He is the self-existent One (Exodus 3:14) and the Source of all life (John 5:26) The sublime opening of the Scriptures announces the fact of GOD and His existence: "In the beginning God" (Genesis 1:1) Nor is the rise or dawn of the idea of GOD in the mind of man

**Knowledge, freedom and the problem of evil**

conclusive proof that God does not exist This argument has been countered by what has come to be called the free-will defense Argued recently by Alvin Plantinga among others, it maintains that a perfectly good, omniscient, omnipotent God will not necessarily prevent all evil
