Robert Gagné and the Systematic Design of Instruction

The impact Robert Gagné had on the field of instructional design cannot be understated For example, from his initial work we can trace the evolution of the domains of learning from the Conditions of Learning through other theories such as Merrill's Component Display Theory (1994), to Smith and Ragan's Instructional Design Theory

n A learning theory consists of a set of propositions and constructs that account for how changes in human performance abilities come about n An instructional theory describes the conditions under which one can intentionally arrange for the learning of specific performance outcomes
