In the Old World a few members of the most widely distributed family, Salamandridae, reach the tropics in southern China and northern Vietnam, Laos, and Thailand All but one of the families (Hynobiidae) live in North America, which has five endemic families (AmphibiaWeb 2009) Most salamanders have a generalized vertebrate morphology
