### **Salivary gland Outcomes of interventional sialendoscopy ...**

Major salivary gland dysfunction, and is more frequent than neoplastic disorders. Although very few prevalence studies are available, epidemiological considerations indicate that about 16,000 patients a year are admitted to hospital because of obstructive salivary gland symptoms in Western Europe.<sup>1-3</sup>
